These extraordinarily simple lyrics from the song "Summertime, Summertime," by The Jamies (the only hit this group ever recorded, by the way) come to mind every year around this time. So does the equally simple tune, which I must admit, I've been humming over and over to myself for the past few days. I know why I remember this song every year as Memorial Day rolls around. The song reminds me of a time when summer was carefree; when the pace was slower and the responsibilities were fewer. And that invariably brings a smile to my face.

And when I think about simplicity, particularly summertime simplicity, another notion springs to mind:

If you're like me and occasionally visit a cardiologist, you have probably heard of the remarkable health benefits of the "Mediterranean Diet." It appears that while people living in Mediterranean countries tend to consume relatively high amounts of fat, they have far lower rates of cardiovascular disease than in countries like the United States, where similar levels of fat consumption are found.

Well, here's my theory on the Mediterranean Diet: It has nothing to do with olive oil or red wine. The reason that people in Mediterranean countries have less incidence of cardiovascular disease is not because of their diet, it's because they take the whole month of August off every year! These folks know that summer is for slowing down and they practice what they preach.

Wayne Muller, in his book Sabbath: Remembering the Rhythm of Rest and Delight, makes some useful points that could benefit all of us.

• Rest is not just a psychological convenience; it is a spiritual and biological necessity.

• Perhaps this is why, in our spiritual tradition (and in others), "Remember the Sabbath" is more than simply a lifestyle suggestion, it is a Commandment.

• Let us take a collective breath, rest, pray, meditate, walk, sing, eat and take time to share the unhurried company of those we love.

• God does not want us to be exhausted; God wants us to be happy. And so let us remember the Sabbath.

So, my friends, while I know that for some of you who live and work in our resort community this will be very difficult to do, be sure to take some time to rest this summer. Think of it as a way to observe the Sabbath.
