Message from your Pastor:

As we get closer and closer to a presidential election that may go down as the most divisive in our history, I find myself thinking about another president who served during troubled times: Abraham Lincoln. Our 16th President was a consummate orator. Along with Patrick Henry's "Give me liberty or give me death," JFK's "Ask not what your country can do for you — ask what you can do for your country," and Ronald Reagan's "Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall," Lincoln's "Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated

to the proposition that all men are created equal" is undoubtedly one of the most memorable and often quoted public statements of all time. Perhaps Lincoln's greatest strength as an orator, though, was his ability to put huge, important thoughts into speeches of a few words. His most famous – the Gettysburg Address, from which I guoted above – was not actually written on the back of an envelope, as some legends suggest; but it could almost fit on one. Whether our new president turns out to be Hillary Clinton or Donald Trump, I hope that he or she thinks of Lincoln as an example to be emulated. His willingness to listen to the opinions of others who disagreed with him, made famous in Doris Kearns Goodwin's bestselling book Team of Rivals, and his steadfast commitment to doing what was right, not necessarily what was most popular, makes Lincoln a wonderful role model for any president. That he was able to hold fast to his principles and accomplish what he did in a time when the country was literally torn apart makes him a wonderful role model for anyone. Lincoln's Second Inaugural Address is my favorite of his speeches. It is arguably his most spiritual. And it also is a perfect example of his willingness to treat those who opposed him with respect. "With malice toward none; with charity for all," he said to the gathered thousands. "With firmness in the right, as God gives us to see the right, let us strive on to finish the work we are in...to do all which may achieve and cherish a just and lasting peace, among ourselves, and with all nations." Whether you believe that the upcoming election of the 45th president of the United States marks the beginning of a new era in American politics, positive or negative, or if you are someone who feels that it is just another of the many swings in the pendulum that can be observed over the history of our country, please join me, on this eve of a new Administration, in prayer that those wonderful words of Lincoln will define the way our nation is governed in the years ahead and that "peace, among ourselves and with all nations," will come to fruition. And join me, as well, in a commitment to do everything within our power to work to make that ideal a reality. Blessings for a wonderful Advent and Christmas,

Christmas Eve should provide a fitting climax to the Advent season for everyone as we celebrate in our traditional manner with our Service of Candlelight and Communion, at 7:00 PM. Candles will be distributed and you will be invited to join in the traditional songs that make Christmas Eve a special experience.

On this Sunday, Christmas Day, we will share in an informal service of lessons and carols.
