From the Pastors' Pen...

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

My message is based on an article from last month's issue of *Living Lutheran* called "*The 'e' word."* This article has to do with the word "evangelical" – a word present in the name of our denomination: The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. This article articulates ideas that I feel are worthy sharing.

In our society, the word "evangelical" has become associated with a particular kind of Christian. In the 1980s, this group gained notable presence in the political arena. That group of Christians is identified largely by their position on such moral issues as abortion, gun control, etc. Since they have become such a prominent force in our culture, "evangelical" Christians have largely determined what it means to be a Christian in our country.

For Lutheran Christians our understanding of what it means to be "evangelical" is radically different. Our understanding comes from the original Greek word, "euangelion" which means "gospel" or "good news." In addition, our understanding comes from our Reformation history. Martin Luther's key insight is that the "good news" of Jesus is that we are loved by God and saved by God's grace through faith, not by the good things we do. Because of the good news, we are free to live in joy and peace knowing that God loves us despite our sinfulness. Lutherans do good works not to earn salvation, but because doing good works is a faithful and thankful response to what God has already done for us. 1 John 4:19 summarizes well with the words that we love others because Jesus has first loved us.

Due to baggage that comes with the term "evangelical", many Lutherans shy away from its use. This is unfortunate because we have let "a small group of Christians who actually are more legalistic than evangelistic" steal the word from us. (Wengert, p. 18)

We, who are part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, need to not only take the word back, but we need also to reclaim an evangelical spirit. What do we mean by an evangelical spirit? We understand "evangelical spirit" to mean a sense of urgency in sharing the good news of Jesus with those we meet. It means letting people know that, in Jesus, God's kingdom has come near, and that God offers hope, love, salvation and freedom to all.

How we do that? ELCA pastor and church renewal consultant, Dave Daubert says: "Most everybody knows what to do to make a church healthier. Be more excited about your faith; help people love Jesus more; be more active in the community; share your faith with others; love God; love people; and make sure people know why you're doing the whole thing." (p. 19)

## From your Council President-

One of our wise Church members said in our Annual Congregation meeting, you can't just meet here as a congregation and expect the building not to suffer. We are at a time where we must maintain our building to ensure we can forward with our church mission and services.

As you have heard us talk about this for the last few months, we have now gathered and clarified items to be on our church Wish List. On this list are items that we need, but have not been put in the budget. These items are needed for overall maintenance of the building and property or replacement for the needs of the service. Some of these items are urgent, as issues of overall safety of our members and visitors who utilize our building are now present. Please prayerfully consider donating monies, time, and talents for any of these items. There is a poster board and list on the wall in the Narthex showing items/monies needed. The Lighthouse, on the posterboard, has the three steps already colored in as we have received some monies/items....Let's get the entire Lighthouse, a beacon of hope and strength, completely color in.

Please keep in mind, that with the window replacements that we are looking for, most of the windows do not properly close, thus we are incurring higher heating and cooling costs, as well as open ourselves up to certain liabilities and/or break-ins as technically the building is never fully closed. In addition to the windows being a liability, many of the stair treads leading up to second floor are broken or loose, and need to be replaced so as not to have tripping/falling hazards. Also the carpets in the upstairs hallways and classrooms are full of ripples and stains, so the carpets must be stretched and cleaned in order to not have those same hazards. The parking lot on the south side of the building must be repaired, as there are many potholes, creating hazardous conditions for all who utilize the lot. The pigeons under the solar panels create fire hazards, not just the musical accompaniment to our Sunday worship voices, so they must be removed and areas damaged by their occupation, repaired.

WITH THE MOUNTING AMOUNT OF REPAIRS AND WISH LIST ITEMS NEEDED, IN ADDITION TO LOOKING FOR FUNDING/DONATIONS FOR THOSE ITEMS, WE ARE ALSO LOOKING FOR A PERSON TO BE OUR PROPERTY COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN TO OVERSEA/COORDINATE ALL ITEMS NEEDED TO BE COMPLETED/PURCHASED......PLEASE REACH OUT TO DAWNE THUMHART OR BOB LIEFESTE IF YOU WISH TO HELP OUT AND FILL THAT POSITION.

Please help out in any way shape or form you can to help us through this process. Yes, unfortunately many of these came to a head at one time, which happens frequently in old buildings. Things become urgent, quickly....If we made it through the reconstruction of Superstorm Sandy, I have no doubt we can go through this with ease.

- new window treatments for All Saints Hall.
- Replacements for stair tread mounts on stairs leading upstairs on both flights of inside stairs (North and South sides) as many as loose or broken.

## Items needed to be completed:

- Sand and Paint poles by kitchen door, gas meter, and part of door outside to Furnace room.
- Sand and Paint covers of heating registers in both downstairs bathrooms.
- Screws put in communion assistants/ pastors pews on alter to mount them firmly to floor.
- People needed for weed control in Victory Garden beds and parking lot. We already have
  one volunteer who does most of grass cutting and gardening, but need more people to help
  with sheer volume of work.
- Label working/nonworking thermostats upstairs.
- Upstairs smoke detectors replaced. Ceiling tile in upstairs hallways and classrooms replace.
- Light and ceiling tiles in mini-hallway between classrooms 204/206 to be repaired/replaced.
- Carpets in upstairs classrooms and hallway, cleaned and stretched, removing tripping hazards.
- Pigeon remediation processes completed.
- Old stair treads removed and new replacements installed.
- Installation of windows (and wooden sills) completed.

The Mens Club meeting is every third Friday of the month at different restaurants. We discuss everything, but politics. There is good comaradarie and there are a few laughs along the way.
