But, should you wish to embark on a slightly less complex project, we'll also have patterns to crochet cuddly, small octopi that can be used to comfort preemies in the NICU units in area hospitals. They are adorable! We hope to meet the third Thursday of every month. ## A note from your Editor :

This time of year, we reflect on how we can best use our "time and talents" in our church and in our community. We all are blessed in different ways. Some can give more of their time and/or money to their church, families, and community and some may give less. The two are not in competition with each other, just like the ebb and flow of the tides/ life are not a competition. Things change all the time in our church life and in our own lives. Ecclesiastes, Chapter 3, tells us exactly that; there is season/ time in life for everything. Matthew, Chapter 6, tells us not to store our treasures here on Earth but in Heaven. I have come across two areas that hit a little close to home.

The last few weeks I have watched the different social media sites regarding the DEVASTATION that hit the lower Outer Banks, specifically the tiny Island of Ocracoke. They, like our community, had their homes, businesses, and places of worship destroyed by Hurricane Dorian in September. The main road on the island still has not been repaired 2 months later. Only 4 wheel drive vehicles and those belonging to NC DOT repair crews are able to be on the road in from the ferry drop-off points. Remember how we struggled to regain some sense of normalcy for our friends and families in the aftermath of Sandy. They too are struggling to do the same. The only way on and off this small island is by a 35 minute ferry ride. There is SIGNIFICANT need for help for the island. We, here on LBI and in our surrounding communities, were extremely fortunate to have help over the long recovery. Our church, our families- they all received some sort of help.

Zion Lutheran Church in Egg Harbor City, NJ, whose Pastor is Kathleen Harris (whose husband, Jim Harris, is our Synod Treasurer), has in their congregation, a young family in need. That family is very active in the church and community. The family has a disabled 5 year old son that suffers from a disease called Holoprosencephaly. The little one's name is Keegan Findieson. He is a bright ray of sunshine. He is also a growing boy who has out grown car seats and pediatric car chairs that help transport him safely in

the family car. The family is now in immediate need of a handicapped accessible van to allow the family to continue to attend church and community events TOGETHER AS A FAMILY. A Go-Fund Me site, started by Keegan's therapy team, has been set up for Keegan to help obtain that item. She wrote a very powerful letter and attached it to the site. It will also be on the church bulletin board. Keegan's grandmother is my childhood best friend and extremely active in her church and synod wide Youth programs.

Attached to the Tidings, you will find attached links for help for those on Ocracoke Island and for Keegan. I also will put copies on the bulletin board and tables.

During a time of indecision in the Lutheran Church and here at HTLC, our offerings were divided between the church and what was called "Council Defined Benevolence". Monies each year would go to a different charity, one local, one state, one national, and worldwide. We no longer have that line item or division within the Church. It's now up to us as individuals, how our heart moves us, to help our neighbor in need.

As you prayerfully consider how you can help out your church during this month of Stewardship, also consider how you can help your Christian neighbor in need, whether that community is near or far.....Something to think about...hmmm.

Through Him, We can do great things.
