About Holy Communion at Holy Trinity

The church council, consistent with recommended guidelines, has decided that Holy Communion will be distributed in the following way:

- The pastor and worship assistant will bring the sacrament to those who process to the altar.
- The pastor and worship assistant will take appropriate precautions such as sanitizing hands immediately prior to the distribution, wearing face coverings, etc.
- Communion will be served in one kind with the wafer being offered to each communicant. The worship assistant will follow with the chalice containing wine and allow for communicants to reverence the cup without receiving the wine. Each communicant will hear the words, "The body and blood of Christ, given and shed for you."

It's almost that time of year again; Time to start thinking about your pledge cards for the 2022 year so that your Council can effectively plan a budget for the 2022 fiscal year. It's finally time to gather again as a community in a seasonally-focused conversation about God! YAY! On October 21, 2021 at 6 p.m., we will begin by refreshing our understanding of Dwelling in the Word, Journaling Scripture, Memorizing Scripture and the Examen Prayer. Our goal will be to dive deeply into what we have come to know about our faith and God through Covid and its mandated quarantining. We'll be revisiting themes from our last meeting, and then introduce "The Daily Office," an intentional time set apart in our day to pause with God. Come at 6 p.m., bring a light supper, and be prepared to learn together through fellowship!
